The Holy Father Pope Benedict XVI has declared this year as a Jubilee Year of Priests in recognition of the centrality of the ministerial Priesthood in the life of the Catholic Church. This declaration was made on the 19th of June 2009 and will end next year 2010.

Saint Marie John Vienne, the 19th century cure of Ares, will be the subject of attention as a model Priest and will be proclaimed the patron of priests the world over. Saint Marie John Vienne is outstanding when it comes to the qualities of a priest in the exercise of priestly duties. This proclamation of the Holy Father challenges all Priests to live a proven probity and to live above reproach by making every effort to walk more closely with Christ as from this year forward than they have ever been in their lives. Priests should endeavor to eschew life styles that could bring the image of the Church into disrepute.

You, the lay faithful, are also called to be supportive of your Priests by praying for them and accord them the reverence they deserve so that they can be the Priests you want them to be. Bear with their weaknesses and assist them to stand again on their feet should they accidentally fall.

May this year of the Priests enlighten us all and may many young men offer their lives for service in the Lord's vineyard.
